AREAS OF INQUIRY

- Temperament, cognitive deficits, and subthreshold symptomatology as barriers to global interepisode functioning and as hallmarks of disease subtype in bipolar spectrum disorders
- Inflammation as a root cause underlying multisystem disease processes; bipolar disorder as a multisystem inflammatory disease; chronic inflammation as an outcome of childhood adversity
- Pathophysiology, neuroanatomy, and development of psychopathology in context of early trauma and neglect
- Neuroprotective value of lithium, omega-3 fatty acids, and n-acetyl cysteine
- Utility of low-dose naltrexone in treatment of rumination and autoimmune disease
- Foundational health habits and adaptogenic compounds: hormesis and immune system support as axes of influence in anxiety and cognition
- Addressing tolerance, length of therapeutic action time, and side effects of amphetamines with NMDA antagonists
- Oppositional tolerance: characterization and treatment of post-acute antidepressant withdrawal syndromes
- NMDAR as a therapeutic target for mood, cognition, impulsivity, and compulsivity
